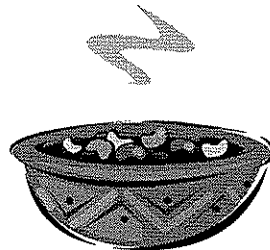

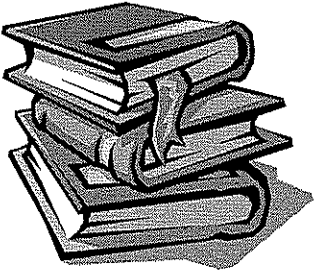

Front Door Repairs and Replacement

Replacement of a unit's front door, including the window insert, is the responsibility of the homeowner.

The front doors DO NOT come with the window or window panel inserted. The window is a double-pane sealed unit that fits into a frame, specifically tailored for our front doors.

The frosted glass originally in Pelican Point front doors is no longer made. However, the same manufacturer of those window units now makes them in a slightly-different "model," but same dimensions. Replacement doors, window frames and windows can be ordered from Probuild, 8037 Midway Dr., Littleton, CO 80126. They can be reached at 303-791-3715.

The door and window components are manufactured by ThermaTru. For more information, search their site for "frosted images glass." Thermatru.com/products/entry/steel-entry-doors/traditions/index.aspx.

- The Door model number is TS209, Steel 9-panel. 3/0 6/8 1 3/4". Probuild Item #42999999E.
- The model number for the frame only, but not the glass insert is "Surround for DL190 7/1/2 x 18 1/2 SOITE."
- The frosted window pane model number is "BL 190 Crystal Line Inster Brass SOD."

Hazardous Waste Pickup: Keep dangerous chemicals out of landfills. For a \$15.00 co-payment, the City of Denver will pick up your household hazardous waste and dispose of it properly. To qualify you must have either:

- A minimum of 25 pounds of any one material listed under the Acceptable Household Hazardous Waste list. * Please note that they will not make appointments for only latex paint.

OR

- A minimum of 3 different types of materials listed under the Acceptable Household Hazardous Waste list.

Electronics Recycling: Best Buy and Staples offer free electronics recycling at their stores.

Best Buy: Consumers can drop off items with screens up to 32 inches for tube televisions and 60 inches for flat-panel televisions. The in-store recycling program includes computer monitors, DVD players, audio and video cables, cell phones and other electronics.
