Two openings for 2021 Pelican Pointe HOA Board of Directors

Homeowners Association Board President Charlotte Robinson had stepped away from that role, but has agreed to resume the remainder of her term through this year. She will not seek election to another three-year term. A second Board vacancy is the seat held by Marcia Helfant whose second term expires this year. An election to fill these two seats will be addressed during the upcoming 2020 Annual Meeting.

Candidates NEEDED: Any homeowner in good standing may run for election to the Board. Homeowners are encouraged to consider becoming a candidate to serve a three-year term. Past Board members have said that being on the Pelican Pointe Board has been a very satisfying way to support our community. While we do retain the services of a management company, the Board directs the management company. Board members prepare, monitor and manage the budget. They oversee maintenance of the overall property and attempt to ensure that the actions of the Board are in compliance with the laws of the State of Colorado and the Association's governing documents. It is the Board's job to enforce the Association Rules and to amend them as necessary. The Board does its best to represent all Pelican Pointe homeowners.

Copies of the above documents will be placed at all mail kiosks.

Did you know more than 90% of calls made to 911 are now from mobile phones? Mobile phones are great but can create challenges to the 911 call taker. We strongly urge you to register your mobile phone with Smart 911. This will help identify your address, assist if the caller cannot communicate, if there is a medical emergency or if your vehicle is in an accident. Smart 911 also helps identify if you have kids, pets at home and will help communicate that information to first responders. 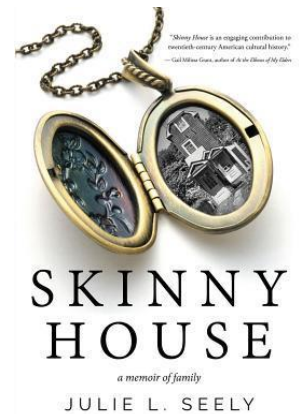
